To parents:

This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

What we learned:



Today, the children discovered the significance of the Passover feast, and learned how Jesus became the ultimate Passover lamb who was sacrificed for our salvation. During class, the children participated in a tasty feast to help them visualize the time Jesus and his disciples met in the upper room to celebrate Passover, which we sometimes call "The Lord's Supper." (Scripture used: John 13:1-17, Matthew 26:17-30)

Memory Verse:



"Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29b NIV

Practice this verse several times with your child during the week. This will not only help your child remember the verse, but it will also help to reinforce what he or she learned during class.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:

Explore the meaning of Passover with your child, by first reading the story found in Exodus 12:1-30. Then start your own tradition to celebrate this time of the year. Perhaps with a special cookie, or meal that you both enjoy.



(Passover is a festival celebrating the deliverance of Israel from the bondage of slavery to the Egyptians, and more specifically for sparing the firstborn children from the last plague of death. By taking the blood of a lamb and spreading it over the doorposts of their homes, the Lord knew which homes to cause the plague to pass over. The Egyptians, however, suffered many losses, and so let the Israelites leave. As Christians, we can also celebrate Passover by recognizing that Jesus is our Passover lamb. He shed His blood to take away our sins so we can live.)

Daily Prayer:



Dear Lord, as we celebrate this time of the year, help us remember the sacrifice You made long ago: how You gave Your life up on the cross so we could live and be free from sin. Thank You, Lord, for loving us so much. Amen.
