What we learned:



Today, we learned the importance of having patience and perseverance, especially when it comes to doing the will of God. We examined the patience demonstrated by Noah, when asked to build an ark, carried out God's instructions despite the mockery of the people around him. It would have been easy for Noah to give up. What a tremendous task. But with faith and perseverance, he received what God had promised him. Christians with real faith do not give up because something is hard or takes a long time. Memory Verse:
