To parents:

This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

What we learned:



Today, we discovered the significance of God's covenant and reviewed the story of Noah. The world during the time of Noah was corrupt in God's eyes and full of violence. Not unlike the world today. However, like Noah, we can live righteous lives instead of doing bad things. As the ark provided safety for Noah and his family, our hope for salvation is in Jesus. As God asked Noah to come into the safety of the ark, Jesus is asking us to let Him come into our hearts. God's judgment is fair, and must be poured out upon sin, but Jesus paid the price for us. We can be thankful that God promised never to destroy the earth again with a flood. With this covenant, He is showing His great patience towards us. (Scripture used: Genesis 8:20-22, 9:1-17)

Memory Verse:



"Whenever the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and all living creatures of every kind on the earth." Genesis 9:16 NIV

Practice this verse several times with your child during the week. This will not only help him or her remember the verse, but it will also help to reinforce what he or she learned during class.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Along with your child, use water colors or tempera paint to create a picture of Noah and a rainbow. For the rainbow, use only red, yellow, and blue. Teach your child how mixing the colors together can make all 6 colors of the rainbow. Ask your child what a rainbow means. Learn together the correct order the colors should appear on the rainbow.
