This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

What we learned:



Today was the last lesson about strange events in the Bible. We learned some things about Jesus concerning His future actions. Jesus will one day return as our Warrior King who will defeat the enemies of God (those who refuse to believe in Him and rebel against Him). Furthermore, His actions as a warrior will extinguish sin from the earth so God's dwelling can be with us like He intended at the beginning of creation. Yes, Jesus came as a sacrifice to provide salvation to the world, but He isn't finished yet! Because we know God's word is true, we can find comfort in this prophecy and while heeding the warning of Jesus' future return. (Scriptures used: Revelation 19:11-16)

Memory Verse:



**"I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. With justice he judges and wages war."

Turn to Revelation 19:11 in your Bible and read the verse with your child. Then take turns repeating the verse in silly voices (such as low/high voices or accents) as a fun way to practice the verse. Before moving on, ask your child to repeat the verse with you one last time in a normal voice.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Empty a can of silly string or whipped cream outdoors with your child. Talk about the contents looking like that of a fire-extinguisher, which is used to stop fires from spreading. Then discuss how Jesus will return as a Warrior one day and "extinguish" sin. Sin will stand no chance against Jesus, and His coming will provide restoration to the world!
