*To parents:*

This page lets you know what your child learned today in Sunday School. Included are "Words to Remember" from the Bible, a suggested activity to reinforce the lesson, and a short prayer. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

## What We Learned:



Today we continued learning about God's protection. Last week we learned that God is our Mighty Fortress, or shield, between us and evil. Psalm 91 also tells us that He is our Refuge, or place of safety and rest, when we face trouble. We learned that God is ready to help us and gives us promises when we choose to follow Him. Isn't it amazing that He even promises to help us and send His angels to guard us from harm?! God loves being a part of our lives and is ready to answer us when we are in need. He truly is our Refuge. Scripture used: Psalm 91:9-16

## Words to Remember:

*(Bible versions used are selected to help young children learn and understand the meaning of scripture.)*



**"No harm will overtake you, no harm will come to your tent." Psalm 91:10**

Ask your child to sit across from you at a table. Read the verse out loud and then ask your child to repeat each word when you roll a ball to him or her. You will continue rolling the ball back and forth until every word is repeated. Continue this activity several times this week or until the verse is familiar to you and your child.

## Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Show your child an item that makes you feel loved and safe (such as a Bible, special blanket, a picture, etc.). Explain how the item provides comfort when you are sad, hurt, or angry. Then ask your child to identify something that makes him or her feel safe. Lastly, reiterate that God is our Refuge, and when we remember to ask for His help He will always show up!

## Daily Prayer:



Thank You, God, for being our Refuge! Help us remember that You provide the best safety and strength when we face trouble. And thank You for Jesus' example and for His sacrifice. Amen.
