### To parents:

This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

#### What we learned:



Today we learned why we can be confident in God's forever love and live boldly for Him. God showed us His forever love by sending Jesus to die for our sins, and He continues to show love by caring for us and leading us. We will always have God's love no matter what happens to us, so we don't have to fear the circumstances we face on earth. Instead, we can choose faithfulness to His word and trust His promises. #### **Memory Verse:**



"Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Romans 8:1 NIV

Read the verse with your child. Then pass a bean bag (or a rolled-up pair of socks) while singing a song. When the music stops, whoever is holding the bean bag will recite the verse. Continue this activity until both of you have had a chance to say the verse at least three times. Practice this activity throughout the week to better memorize the verse.

## **Suggested Parent/Child Activity:**



Talk with your child about things that seemingly last "forever," such as large amounts of money, batteries, clothing, going to school, etc. Discuss how long they actually last to make the distinction that we really don't have a good understanding of what "forever" means. Rather, we use the word to describe something that lasts a long time according to our own opinions. But God's forever love truly does last forever! It never ends, so we can trust that God loves us no matter what we face.
