To parents:

This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

What we learned:



In today's lesson children learned about a woman named Rahab. A woman who helped the spies that Joshua had sent to look over the land. Rahab took action and displayed outward evidence of where her loyalties lay. Rahab was preparing for the return of Joshua's army. Like Rahab our outward actions speak louder than words, demonstrate what we believe, and show to whom we are devoted. (Scripture used: Joshua 2:1-24)

Memory Verse:



**"Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth."
1 John 3:18 NIV**

Practice this verse several times with your child during the week. This will help him or her remember the verse and it will also help to reinforce what he or she learned during class.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Explain to your child that actions speak louder than words. It is one thing to tell a sick person that you hope he or she gets better, but it is even better to pray with him or her and then later bring the sick person a hot meal. Have your child make a list of ways he or she can put his or her words into action by helping others. Some ideas include: Helping out around church, collecting canned goods for a food pantry, helping neighbors with yard work, making phone calls to check on elderly members of the church.

Daily Prayer:



Dear Lord, thank You for giving us the ability to help others. Thank You for helping us understand that our outward actions demonstrate to others what we believe and to whom we are devoted. May we always remember that our actions speak louder than words and may our actions always make You happy. Amen.
