This page lets you know what your child learned in Sunday school today. In addition, you will find this week's memory verse, a suggested activity, and a short prayer to reinforce the lesson. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

What we learned:



Today the children began a series on called "True Love," to explore the qualities of God's Love. In this first lesson, the kids discovered that godly love is patient, having the ability to wait for what is really important. This holds true for sports, education, even marriage, but most importantly because we love Jesus, we will wait patiently to be with Him in Heaven. (Scripture used: Genesis 29:1-30)

Memory Verse:



"Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things." 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 KJV

In class, the children are memorizing 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 in four parts. Today, they concentrated on 1 Corinthians 13:4 (the portion in bold). Practice this verse several times with your child during the week. This will not only help him or her remember the verse, but it will also help to reinforce what he or she learned during class.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Discuss the qualities of being patient. First, look up the word patience in the dictionary. Then, using a Bible concordance, find several verses that talk about being patient or long suffering.

- Ask your child to share times they feel a lot of patience is required. (Birthdays, Christmas, going on vacation, end of school year, etc.)
- Why do these events seem to take so long to get here?
- · What makes it hard to wait for these occasions?
