*To parents:*

This page lets you know what your child learned today in Sunday School. Included are "Words to Remember" from the Bible, a suggested activity to reinforce the lesson, and a short prayer. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.

## What We Learned:



Aaron was a good speaker and helped his brother, Moses. God asked Aaron to help Moses deliver His people out of slavery. Aaron even held up one of Moses' hands so they would win a battle! Helping others pleases God because it shows others His love. We should find ways to help others every day. (Scriptures used: Exodus 6:28 -7:7, Exodus 17:8-13)

## Words to Remember:

*(Bible versions used are selected to help young children learn and understand the meaning of scripture.)*



## "Serve one another humbly in love." Galatians 5:13b NIV

Explain to your child that the word "serve" means to treat others the way he or she would like to be treated. Talk about a time when someone helped or served you and how God used the helper to bless you. Then ask your child to identify a way that he or she have been helped and how it felt to receive assistance. Iterate to him or her that because God loves and helps us, we should also love and help others.

## Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Ask your child to assist you with a new chore or time-consuming activity (such as raking leaves). Encourage him or her by admitting that sometimes helping isn't fun and can be hard work, but God is pleased when we work hard as helpers. Tell your child that working hard means learning something new and you are proud of him or her for finishing the chore or activity. Furthermore, talk about the promises God makes in the Bible when we are obedient and willing to serve others (such as rewards, blessings, peace, etc).



## Daily Prayer:

Thank You, God, for showing us how to help others. We want to be examples of Your love by serving one another. Help us work hard and be willing to try new things. Thank You for loving us and sending Jesus to die for our sins. Amen.
